

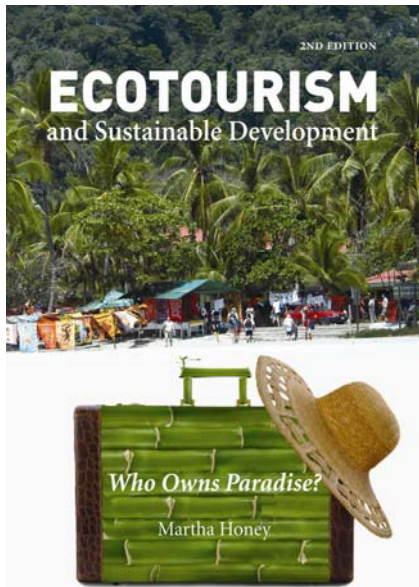
The election is over, winter is coming.... It's time to think about ... getting out of town!

First published in 1999, *Who Owns Paradise?* has been highly acclaimed as the most comprehensive study of both the theory and practice of ecotourism. She's worked in dozens of countries and lived for 20 years in Africa and Central America. *Conde Nast Traveler* magazine recently named Honey one of the world's top ten "eco - and sustainable-travel advocates [who] are making sure there's substance behind the slogans."
